Welcome and Care

Ask young people how best you can make them feel welcomed into your group/ school/service and what things you can do to show them you care.

It is worth considering:

- Do you make time to ask the young person about their day/what they have been up to, showing interest in them?
- Do meeting times suit young people?
- How do you sound when speaking with young people?
- When a young person can't take part in something how do you let them know that is ok?
- How do you let young people know they can take part in as much or as little as they can and are welcome to join in at any time?

Communicate

Ask young people how best to communicate with them.

It is worth considering:

- Do you contact young people in multiple ways?
- How do you make communication accessible for young people who may have different needs?
- Do you use language that a young person understands?
- How do you make your communications warm and friendly?
- How do you enable young people to communicate with you and raise things that are important to them?

Value and include

Ask young people how best you can make them feel included and that you value their views and opinions.

It is worth considering:

- How do you let young people know you think what they have to say is important?
- Do you make enough time and space for a young person to think and contribute?
- How do you let young people know that what they say changes anything or makes a difference? How do you feedback what has happened?

How do you enable young people to raise things that are important to them? Does that come before, after or in between things you would like to talk about?

Partnership

Ask young people how you can work together as equal partners.

- How are ideas generated together?
- Where do ideas and agendas to be discussed come from?
- Are things that are important to young people raised and is consideration given to how to move them forwards?
